Tissue Paper Landscapes

Empty out the giftwrap drawer and use your torn scraps of tissue paper to make something beautiful! Look out your window and create a landscape inspired by the view outside.



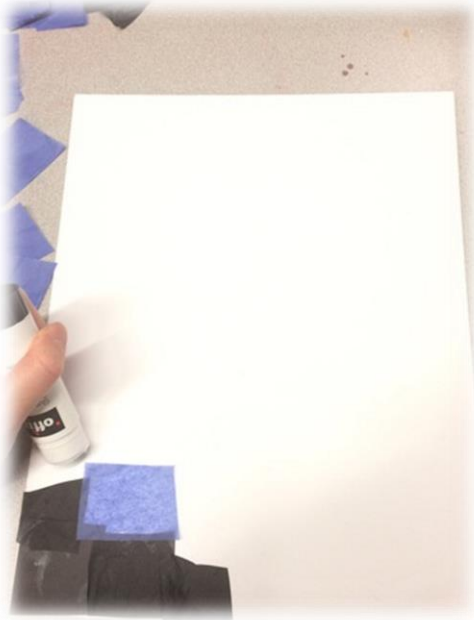
Materials:

- Cardstock
- Tissue Paper
- Glue
- Construction Paper
- Scissors
- Black/Brown Acrylic Paint
- Paint Brush or Sponge
- Water Container

Step 1:

Apply glue to cardstock. Starting with the darkest colour of paper (black), fill in the outer edge of the mat board.



Step 2:

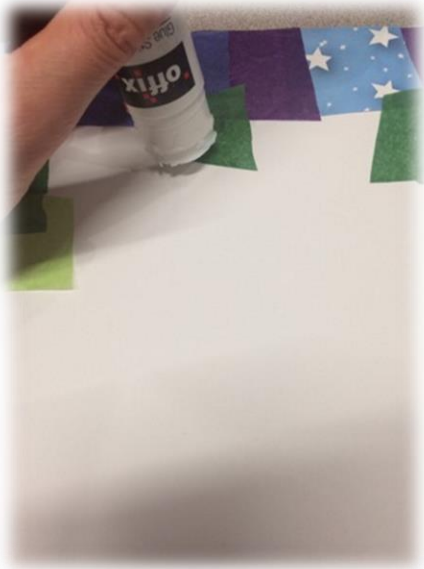
Continue to fill in the edges of the cardstock using glue and tissue paper to form a frame.



This activity is provided to you by:

TIP: You can layer colours of tissue paper on top of each other to make new colours! This is colour mixing through a technique called *layering*.

Example: Lighter green tissue paper layered on top of dark green = a new shade of green!



Step 3:

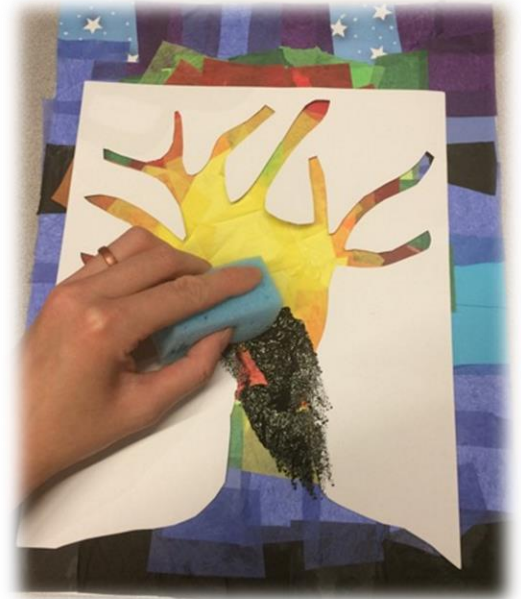
Working from darkest colour to lightest, continue to layer tissue paper and coloured paper, filling in the entire matboard. Think of the colour transitions from dark to light like a rainbow; from purple/blue, green, red, orange then yellow.

Step 4: Paint

Ask for help to make a stencil out of another sheet of cardstock. Your stencil could be a tree, a flower, a fence, a swing or whatever you may see when you look out your window. Place the stencil on top of tissue paper and dip your paintbrush/sponge into black or brown paint. Dab the paint in the tree stencil filling in the entire shape.



Step 4: Construction Paper

If you do not have paint at home, use a piece of black construction paper. Draw the outline of the image you would like and use scissors to cut it out. Glue the silhouette onto your tissue paper collage.
